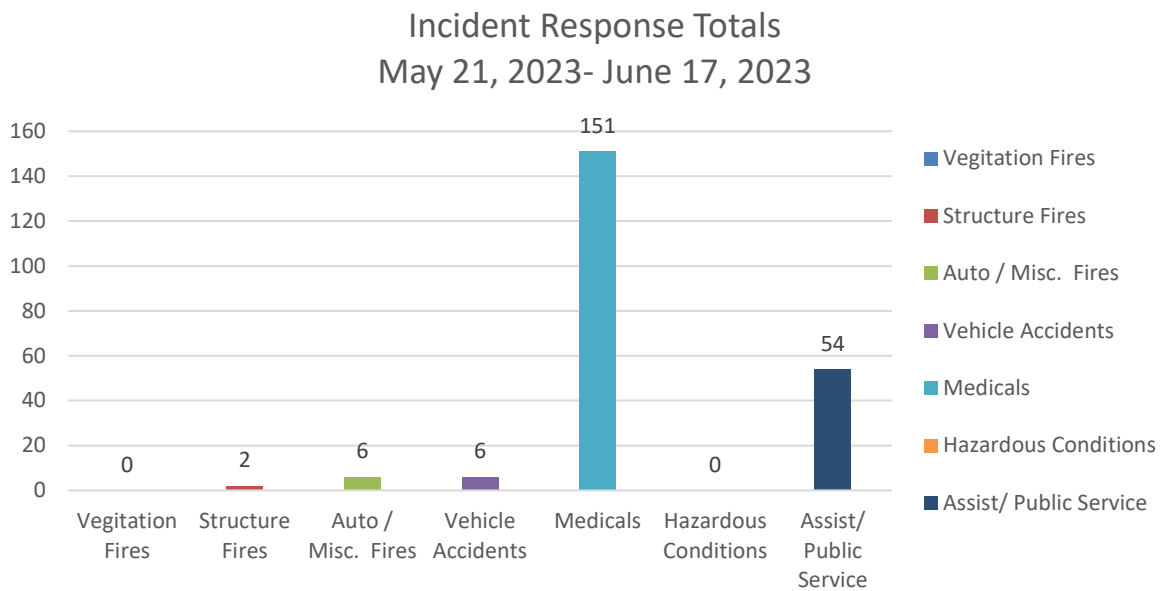

- Defensible space inspections for June

- The CAL FIRE Ponderosa firefighter hand crews will be working in the Cameron Park area the week of 6/28-30. Crews will be working with El Dorado County DOT to clear hydrants and stop signs. The focus is to clear the required 36" from fire hydrants and keep signs visible in the community. On June 29th crews will assist at Cameron Park Lake with weed abatement and bush thinning.
