Recreation Program Updates

I.A. Website Update

Staff has been working with Uptown Studios making final revisions to the website for the upcoming launch. Staff is completing the Summer Activity Guide and this will then be included on the website.

I.B. Older Americans' Month

I.C. Senior Nutrition Program

Facilities staff has been doing the set up and break down of the tables and chairs for the senior nutrition program. The program has been successful with increasing numbers. The number of lunches ordered is up to 35 and on most days all meals are purchased.

I.D. Community Center Kitchen

Staff has purchased items to stock the Community Center Kitchen. The items have been purchased from D&P Enterprises for about \$1,600. The following items, in a variety of sizes and appropriate quantities, have been purchased and received for the kitchen; basting spoons, coffee urns, colanders, cutting boards, French whips, frying pan, ladles, measuring cups, measuring spoons, mixing bowls, oven mitts, plastic pitchers, pot forks, roasting pans, rubber spatulas, rubber spoons, sauce pans, sheet pans, stirring paddles, stock pots, and wood handle turners. I.H. Adult Softball

Banners are hung on the pool fence at the Community Center, at Rasmussen Park, and on the board off Highway 50. Laminated color flyers are up at the Lake, Rasmussen Park, Dave West Park, and Christa McAuliffe Park. Post cards were ordered and are being distributed to local businesses and mailed to sports participants. Posters have been printed. Registration packets are available in the office and out on the tables in the Community Center Hall with the other information. Flyers and registration packets were handed out at the Easter Egg Hunt at the booth. Registration packets have been printed and will be brought to the Shingle Springs Cameron Park Chamber of Commerce and will be sent out to local churches and past participants the week of April 11th-15th. Flyer packets are being worked on to distribute through the El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce the week of April 11th-15th. No registrations have come in as of yet. A free agents list has been started and contains the names of 6 players looking for teams.

- 3.A. Partner with at least two (2) community groups and businesses for joint community projects.
 - Staff is working with the Mormon Church for a cleanup day at the lake and the Sports Groups for a scoop event to bring families to the Community Center to get the SCOOP on the sports groups. Staff meet with representatives from the sports groups on February 22. From this meeting it was decided that the CSD would host a Scoop night – ice cream scoops for \$1 and allow the teams to share their information with the community. – Survey sent to sports groups to get feedback on what month(s) would work best for the scoop night on March 21.

- A facility PowerPoint was completed and displayed at the Affair of the Heart and It's A Wedding Affair Events. An Activity/Event PowerPoint will be designed to use at future events.

- A survey was sent to the following schools February 3rd: Green Valley, Rescue, Buckeye, Blue Oak, Camerado, Pleasant Grove, Millers Hill and the California Montessori Project. It is a survey for students to assess their recreation interests and needs. The deadline for the survey was March 21.

Results of the School Survey

A recreation survey was sent out to local elementary and middle schools in the area including Green Valley, Pleasant Grove, Rescue, Buckeye, Camerado Springs, Blue Oak, Millers Hill, CMP, and Holy Trinity. The survey was open from February 1, 2016 through March 21, 2016. We received 83 responses to the survey. The survey asked about the grade, participation, interests, and new class/program/event requests for participating students. There were requests for 15 new classes/programs along with 3 instructor suggestions. The top requests were for band/music, pottery, archery, dirt bike riding, and acting.
