



Incident Activity

On Monday, September 29th, units B2710, E88, E89, E2751, E2771, E283, E28, E86, E84, and M28 responded to a residential structure fire on Cambridge Road. Engine 88 arrived first on scene and found a single-story, single-family residence with smoke showing from a three-car attached garage. The fire was quickly and professionally extinguished through the coordinated efforts of multiple agencies.

On Saturday November 1st, Engine 88 and Engine 89, along with Rescue Fire Protection District, El Dorado Hills Fire, and El Dorado County Fire, responded to a residential structure fire on Lambeth Court in Rescue. Engine 88 arrived first on scene and reported an exterior fire. The crew from Engine 88 quickly deployed an attack line and extinguished the fire before it could extend into the home. This incident once again demonstrated the effectiveness of automatic aid and the county's closest resource dispatching system in preventing significant property damage.

On Thursday, November 6th, Engine 28 and Engine 91 responded to a vehicle fire in the Forklift parking lot. The fire was quickly knocked down with no damage beyond the vehicle of origin. This incident highlights the importance and effectiveness of the county's robust automatic aid and closest resource system. At the time of the call, Engine 89 was committed to a medical emergency, and the system flexed seamlessly to send the next closest resources.

Training

Stations 88 and 89 continue to host multi-company training with our partner agencies at the Station 89 training tower. These exercises provide valuable opportunities for our firefighters to refine their skills and build effective teamwork with the agencies we respond alongside during real incidents.

In addition, Engine 88 and Engine 89 participated in the Regional Active Shooter Training in Diamond Springs and live fire victim search drills in El Dorado Hills. These hands-on exercises allowed our crews to sharpen their tactical coordination, search techniques, and firefighter safety practices under realistic conditions.

Looking Ahead

We're excited to participate in upcoming community events, including the Annual Santa Parade on December 19, 20, and 21, 2025, spreading holiday cheer throughout our neighborhoods once again. During the parade, we'll be conducting a Toy Drive in partnership with CASA El Dorado. In addition, Cameron Park Santa Parade T-shirts are available for \$25 each, with all proceeds benefiting CASA El Dorado.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Receive and File

Requests for AB38 inspections have started coming in, and the online request system through our website is now fully operational, providing homeowners with an accessible way to request inspections through us. Invoices can now be sent and recorded properly for requested inspections. A comprehensive Home Hardening Assessment Report was finalized to assist homeowners by providing recommendations they can take to make their homes more resilient. Significant progress was made on the Vacant Lot Program, including establishing timelines for 2026, continuing the design of an inspection map, and updating key documents to improve efficiency and clarity.

An introductory meeting with the Greater Cameron Park Fire Safe Council has been scheduled for their next meeting in December.

The search for a suitable work vehicle remains ongoing.
