FROM THE CC&R DEPARTMENT

Welcome new residents! Personalizing the exterior of your new home may be on your list of projects. When making improvements, please be mindful of:

- ❖ **Your Neighborhood’s Covenants, Conditions and Requirements (CC&Rs)** – CC&Rs are attached to every residential property in Cameron Park, and there are over 90 unique neighborhoods with CC&Rs. Landscaping and hardscape setbacks and project requirements are outlined in your neighborhood’s CCRs. Contact the District office or go on line <https://www.cameronpark.org/resident-rules-cc-r-s> to view your CC&Rs.
- ❖ **Approval from the Architectural Review Committee** – The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) is an advisory committee comprised of your neighbors, provides great guidance to homeowners and their approval of your project is required to ensure consistency with CC&Rs. This committee reviews exterior home projects including fences, house paint, roof work, pools, gazebos, flag poles, solar, room additions, sheds, landscaping and tree removal.

These CC&R and ARC Committees were created by the residents of Cameron Park to help guide our residents through the confusion of CC&R’s. These improvements can increase investment, upgrade curb appeal and in some cases even add that extra touch that elevates the rest of the neighborhood.

FROM THE PARKS DEPARTMENT

When the sunshine comes out, do your feet get restless? There are many neighborhood trails in Cameron Park CSD’s park system that can help with restless feet, your pets, kids, grandparents and you too! Royal Oaks Park has an earthen trail that runs parallel to Royal Drive. An earthen trail is also in Gateway Park, which runs parallel to Hillcrest Drive. Rasmussen Park has a trail that follows the perimeter of the park with an access point into the Pine Hill Preserve, a preserve operated by the Bureau of Land Management. At Northview Park, a walking trail parallels Auburn Hills Blvd. All trails are friendly for on-leash dogs.

RENTAL SPACE AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER

We hope as we move into less restrictive tiers, we will be able to rent out the classrooms and Assembly Hall at the Community Center. Please see our website for more details.

Have you purchased one of our Pool, Cameron Park Lake or Combo Passes in the past? The options are now streamlined and rolled into one Annual Pass. It's available **NOW** and valid for one full year from date of purchase! Save 10% with our Early Bird Discount by purchasing before April 30th.

NEW... Buy your passes on-line! The Annual Pass grants access to:

CAMERON PARK LAKE

56 acre park filled with an abundance of amenities such as; a 1.1 mile walking path along the shoreline, tennis and Pickleball courts, a playground, horseshoe pits, catch-and-release fishing, an 18-hole disc golf course, picnic and BBQ areas, and restrooms.

THE COMMUNITY POOL

The annual pass is your ticket into the pool for recreational swim. In addition, pass holders will save \$2 off lap swim or Aquatic Fitness class reservations and 10% off all Special Events held at the Community Pool.

Family: \$180 residents / \$190 non-residents (up to 4 people)

Note: Children 3 and under are FREE

All the F.A.Q.'s

Q: Why should I buy an Annual Pass?

A: Buying a pass makes access to the lake and pool easy. No cash or credit card is required when you arrive at CP Lake or when reserving a Rec Swim time at the pool. Revenues generated from the sales of these passes financially support the District's maintenance of Cameron Park Lake and Community Pool.

Q: I am a resident. Why can't I get into Cameron Park Lake for free? Don't my taxes pay for this amenity?

A: Property tax funds are allocated to many different District services including Fire and Emergency services, youth and adult sports fields, and trails. An annual pass is a user fee to offset costs for maintaining the Lake and Pool, two very important community assets.

Q: What are the Lake kiosk operating hours?

A: Historically, the kiosk has been open late May – early September. With the new Annual Pass program, the kiosk days and hours will be expanded to more months and weekends throughout the year. Pass holders will save on entry fees at the Lake all year.

Q: Will the Swim Lagoon at CP Lake be open this summer?

A: No... this feature is closed and we are in the process of designing a new water-feature play area that we hope to have open by summer of 2022.

Q: I am on a fixed income or have a financial hardship, and I can't afford the cost of this pass – is there anything I can do?

A: Yes... Recreation Participant Program Grants are available to residents with a financial hardship. The process can be completed quickly. For full details and an application, please visit our website or scan the QR code on page 3.

Q: Can I bring my dog to CP Lake or the disc golf course?

A: No.... Pets are not allowed at Cameron Park Lake due to the wildlife (service animals only). We have many other parks that allow pets on leash, like Gateway Park on Cambridge road; or our off-leash dog park, Paul J. Ryan Memorial Park, on Cameron Park Drive and Hacienda Drive.

Q: My child just wants to play on the playground. The other area playgrounds are free. Why do you charge a fee?

A: Annual Pass revenue helps with overall maintenance of the Lake. You can also use your Annual Pass to swim at the pool. If you aren't interested in the other Lake amenities or the Pool, then you can use one of our other playgrounds at Rasmussen Park, Christa McAuliffe, or Northview. Check out our website for more information and location details.

Q: Does the pass include swim lessons, lap swim and exercise classes at the pool?

A: Pass Holders will save \$2 off lap swim or Aquatic Fitness class reservations and 10% off all Special Events held at the Community Pool. Swim lessons are a separate program fee.

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WILDFIRE IS COMING. ARE YOU READY?



Defensible Space is your property's front line defense against wildfire. Creating and maintaining defensible space around your home can dramatically increase your home's chance of surviving a wildfire and improves the safety of firefighters defending your property. 100 feet of defensible space is required by law.*

TWO ZONES MAKE UP THE REQUIRED 100 FEET OF DEFENSIBLE SPACE:

ZONE 1: 30 feet of Lean, Clean & Green

- 1 Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds.
- 2 Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- 3 Keep tree branches 10 feet away from your chimney and other trees.

ZONE 2: 30-100 feet of Reduced Fuel

- 4 Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- 5 Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- 6 Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.

Use Equipment Properly to Keep from Sparking a Wildfire

- 7 Mow before 10 a.m., and never on a hot or windy day. String trimmers are a safer option (vs. lawnmowers) for clearing vegetation.
