

Materials Accepted for Curbside Recycling:

Household Hazardous Waste:

Do Your Part! Recycle in El Dorado County!

Plastic:

All plastic bottles and jugs including: water, milk, soda, juice, liquid soap shampoo and detergent containers.

Paper:

All newspaper, magazines, junk mail, envelopes, bags, catalogs, office paper, phone books, cardboard, packaging from all food products, cardboard boxes.



Glass:

Any color glass food and beverage bottles and jars, with or without labels.

Cans & Metal:

All aluminum, tin, steel and bi-metal food and beverage containers, with or without labels, pots, pans, foil.

Curbside Motor Oil Collection:

Residents can recycle used motor oil curbside. Five gallons can be picked up, and, if requested, empty containers can be dropped off.

Household hazardous waste is accepted free of charge from the citizens of El Dorado County at the Material Recovery Facility (transfer station).

The following items are accepted:

Latex-water- and oil based paints, used motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, solvents and paint removers, adhesives and sealants, pesticides and herbicides, photo processing chemicals, floor and furniture cleaners, batteries (all types), pool chemicals, aerosol cans, fluorescent lights, mercury containing devices, and most products labeled CAUTION, WARNING, DANGER or POISON.

Unacceptable items:

Radioactive materials, medical waste (except home generated sharps), explosives or compressed gas cylinders.

Help our Community do its part to conserve our natural resources and reduce solid waste disposal by recycling and comply with State Law. The 1989 California Integrated Waste Management Act (AB 939) mandates that every city and county divert 50% of its waste from landfills.

Join the El Dorado County Environmental Management Department, the Cameron Park Community Services Districts and El Dorado Disposal in their commitment to reduce solid waste disposal, to reuse and recycle materials.
