



Lifeguard

Definition:

Under the general direction of the Recreation Supervisor, Aquatic Coordinator and/or Head Life Guard, the Lifeguard assures safe water activities by enforcing water safety rules, performs life saving actions in emergency situations, assists in supervising swimmer safety, swim instruction, and special swimming events.

Examples of Duties:

- Patrols swim, deck and boat dock areas to enforce safety rules for the protection of swimmers and bathers.
- Enforces regulations governing the conduct of swim area patrons.
- Shares responsibility with staff for clean up and maintenance of swim, dock and beach areas.
- Maintains an alert vigil at all times in assigned areas of responsibility.
- Enforces **ALL** swim area policies and regulations to maintain discipline in and around the swim area.
- Maintains accurate records of pool activities, injuries, etc.
- Makes rescues, renders first aid and administers artificial respiration and/or cardiopulmonary resuscitation when necessary.
- Maintains a good rapport with co-workers and the general public.
- Completes records as required.
- Assists public with boat rentals by providing renters with correct sized lifejackets and assisting them on and off the boats and/or dock.
- Clocks in and out at entrance of pool or lake when arriving and leaving work.
- Assists in the instruction of swimmers.
- Attends all meetings and training sessions as required.
- Submits time off requests when needed.
- Submits the necessary calendar to supervisor to assist in weekly work schedule
- Update and renew ARC certifications as necessary – Lifeguard, CPR/AED, and Title 22 – all need to be current.
- Performs other related duties as required.

Qualifications:

Knowledge of:

Water safety rules, the methods of efficient and safe operations of the swimming pool, swim area, and the techniques of lifesaving.

Skilled in:

Following oral and written instructions, performs cardiopulmonary resuscitation, artificial respiration, and administer first aid, communicating and enforcing approved policies and procedures.

Other requirements:

At least 15 years of age, with visual acuity, color vision and hearing sufficient to perform the assigned duties as well as physical strength, dexterity and agility necessary to perform the duties of the position, and current Lifeguard Training, CPR /AED, and EMSA (Title 22) certifications.

Education and experience:

Involved in High School education, knowledge of water safety rules, previous swimming experience or Jr. Lifeguard experience recommended.

Abilities:

- The job will include a variety of lifting, walking, swimming, bending, reaching, sitting, standing, and writing.
- The approximate percentage for each shift is: 47% sitting, 24% standing, 15% walking, 5% swimming, 4% reaching and/or bending, 3% writing, and 2% lifting.
- These percentages are estimated and can vary daily depending upon the number of patrons or activities at the swimming areas, and rotation of the lifeguard.

Pay Rate:

This is a part-time, seasonal position.

Hours may fluctuate, starting at 15 hours per week.
